Frederick Warde, who today stands at the head of the dramatic profession in the interpretation of Shakespeare, was in the city today on his way to receive where he returns at the entertainment.

Mr. Warde, who has one of the most remarkable memories of any man in this country and seems to know every man, woman and child in every town in the United States, has many friends in McAlester who called upon him while he was in the city.

A representative of the Capital managed to get hold of him for a few minutes and tackled him for an interview.

"What's the use?" exclaimed the tragedian with the most comical twist to his face. "Go out and write an interview. I am on in your newspaper fellows. Haven't been making the boards most of my life for nothing. Two-thirds of your 'dope' is imagined. That is where you are geniuses. Now in my profession we have to stick to fact, strict fact. We have the lines of the writer to interpret and we interpret them—as we please.

"You want to know why I left the stage? Do you want truth or fiction? It does not matter? Well, sir, I left the stage because the public demand for Shakespeare has ceased. It does not pay. Art is all right, but the artist must live. The gradual evolution of the drama in this country has rendered it unsatisfactory. Perhaps a three-act play comes along, the public will go back to the other side, but I fear that will be long after my days are over. But it's dinner time, sir, and I am hungry, and you know I cannot talk entertainingly when I am hungry."

Whereupon the interview was closed for the time being and the man whose business it was to make people weep classic tears went into the dining room and proceeded to keep even the waters Shakespearean by laughing by his imitative jokes, his humorous facial expressions and his infinitely interesting anecdotes.

A GREAT LECTURE

ON SAVONAROLA BY DR. GUNSAULUS AT THE CHAU-BAUQUASS.

IS A CLASSIC ORATOR HIS THEME WAS PHILOSOPHICAL AND HE SHOULD BE CALLED BROWNING OF ELOQUENCE

The Audience Was Appreciative and Listened With Much Interest.

St. Paul, Minn., June 30.—The marked similarity of the details which govern the lecture of Dr. Gunsaulus to the ideals of Browning, namely the living of the whole, the sense of the life, and the depth of his intellect together with his peculiar interest which he, as well as Browning, takes in the renascence period, of Italy again makes it more evident that Dr. Gunsaulus well deserves to be called the Browning of Eloquence.

And now to the last consideration of the man. Men who are exceedingly prominent are never great with Browning's humor. Dr. Gunsaulus has a decided sense of humor, yet it is of the philosophical kind. It is the humor which does not bring a tear or a smile, but a beyond a laugh. He knows how to bring a laugh out of his audience and, himself, sees the great principle of humor behind things. As a satirist he is beyond an outline and a fact. The humor of his ability was a success with her audience.

His lecture was a sermon, as all great lectures are, and it was calculated to make one think and to live a bigger and broader idealist.
